 - Damitha Adikaari thanked NIRAB for its work and noted that the R&DI recommendations would be important for his team to consider.

 - Minister Bowie thanks NIRAB and NIRO members for the hard work and time they have put in producing the upcoming report, as it will be pivotal for the future of AMRs.
- 5. Update from Department of Energy, Security and Net Zero
 - Government now focusing on the importance of fixing loopholes in laws and regulations which don't apply to non-electricity generation in nuclear.
 - London, 28th March: deep dive on chapter 4 of the Alternative Routes to Market Consultation.
 - Debates over siting are being carried out currently within government.
